Captain Brian Nanavaty is a 33 year veteran of law enforcement currently serving as professional performance manager for the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department (IMPD) where his innovative officer and agency wellness and development programs have created a culture of health and have resulted in a reduction of disciplinary referrals by 40%. During his career Nanavaty has instructed thousands of officers, supervisors, executives and clinicians in the areas of personal and career survival for the Department of Justice VALOR program, *Safe Call Now* and at IACP, ILEETA, IADLEST, NOBLE, FOP and FBI conferences. He has been featured on *Police One.com* and in *Law and Order* magazine and in the *FBI Law Enforcement Bulletin*. Nanavaty was previously Adjunct Professor of Criminal Justice at Indiana and Purdue Universities where he was the recipient of the *Faculty Excellence* award. In 2015, Nanavaty and IMPD received the DOJ, BJA and NLEOMF *Destination Zero Valor Award* for officer and agency wellness and in 2016 Nanavaty was a finalist for the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) *Officer of the Year* for his groundbreaking work in the area of officer wellness and development. In 2016, the White House sent US Attorney General Loretta Lynch to Indianapolis as part of the *President's Task Force on 21st Century Policing* where Lynch stated “*Captain Nanavaty’s officer and agency wellness program in Indianapolis should be the model for law enforcement across the US.*”
